Grange Celebrates Black History Month

Dear Family of Grange,

On Monday, Grange pupils met with Selena Carty from Narrative Eye, an organisation dedicated to promoting equality and social change through education. Selena shared many interesting facts about the number of Black and African soldiers who had taken part in different wars across the globe and in particular, the First World War. She also spoke about the many other nationalities who contributed to the First World War.

Our children learnt a song about Walter Daniel John Tull, an English professional footballer who played as an inside forward for Tottenham Hotspur and Northampton. Walter Tull was the first black officer in the British Army.

During the First World War, Tull served in the Footballers' Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment, and fought in the Battle of the Somme in 1916. He was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant on 30 May 1917. Tull fought in Italy in 1917–18, and was mentioned in dis-

patches for "gallantry and coolness" while leading his company of 26 men on a raiding party into enemy territory. He returned to France in 1918, and was killed in action on 25 March during the Spring Offensive at the age of 29.

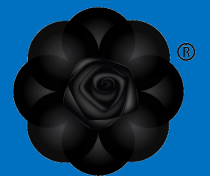
Grange pupils enjoyed listening to all these interesting facts and learning to march like soldiers. Selena showed the children The Black Poppy Rose which has been created to remember all African and Black ancestors who contributed in many ways towards World War One. It also illustrates the pride and honour held for our ancestors and also for the future generations to be empowered by their history. Here is what it stands for:

Black – Is for the people

Poppy – is for remembrance

Rose – is for honour and respect

Selena will be coming back to us on Monday, 19th October. We look forward to having her again and hearing more interesting and empowering stories.



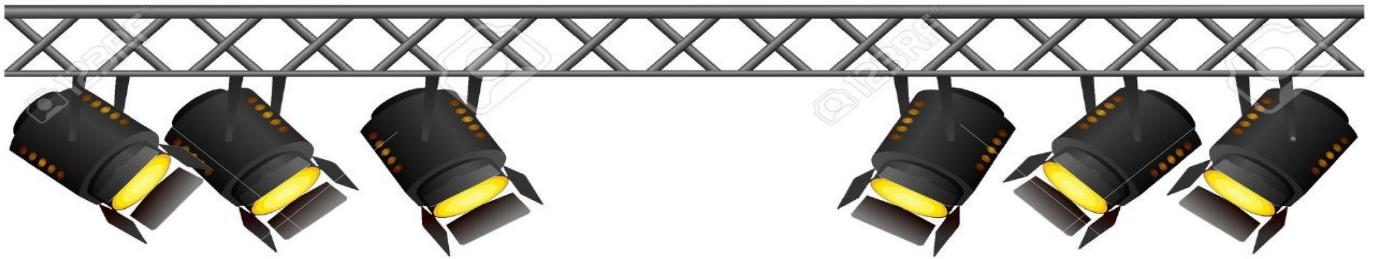

English
