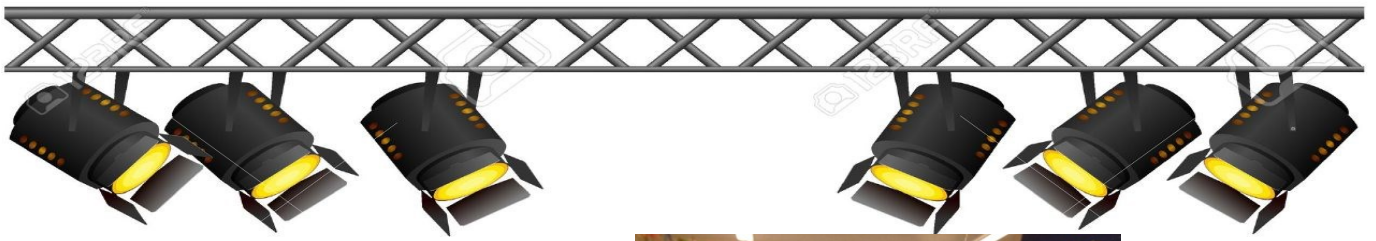

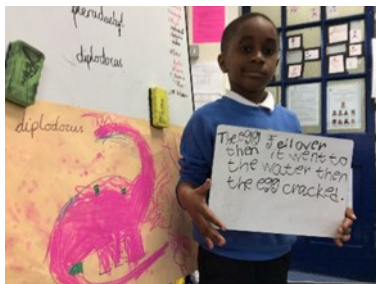
Moon

Moon Class have been learning about different parts of a plant and in Mathematics they have started to learn about subtraction. They have also been busy making lovely cards Mother's Day.



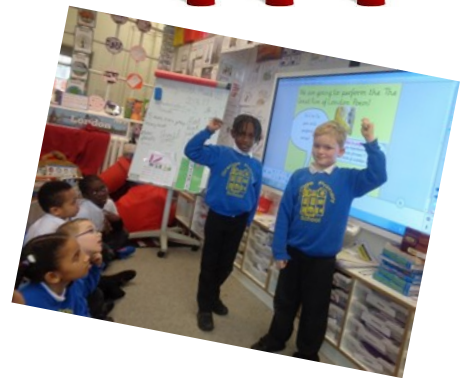
Star

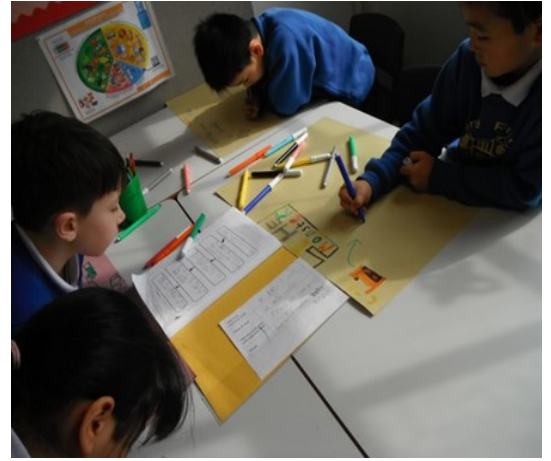
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Jupiter

This week in Maths Kitchen Club we made dirt puddings to help us build our knowledge of measurements.

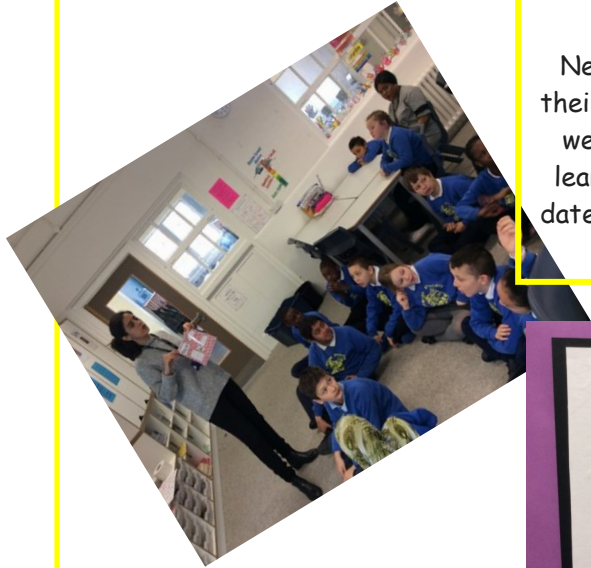


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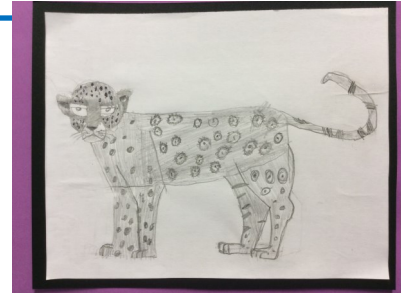
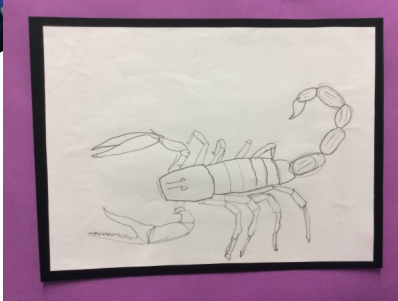


Neptune

Sky

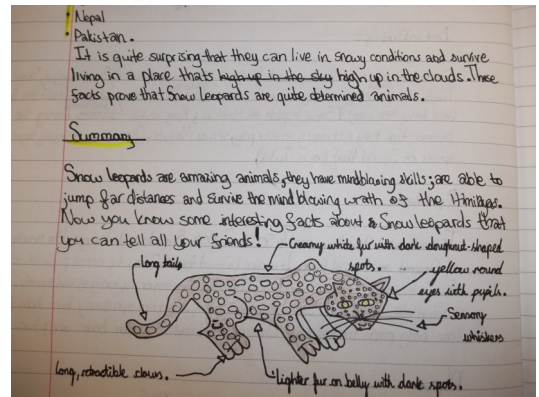
