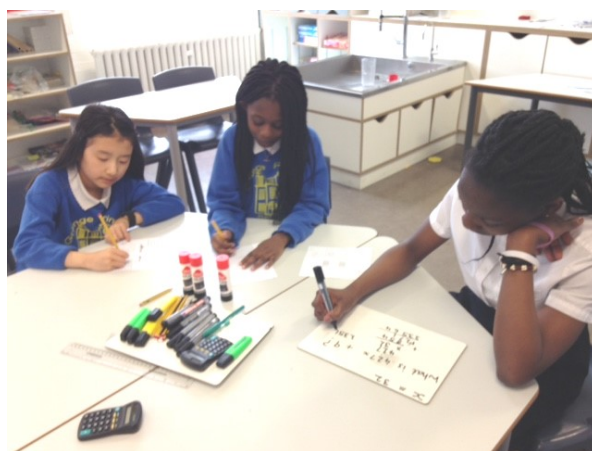


Neptune
