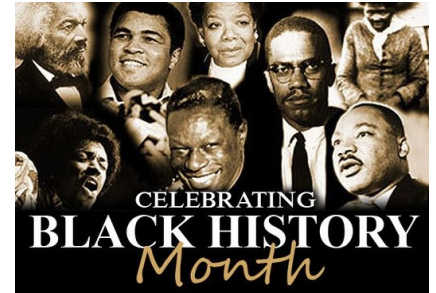
Dear Grange families,

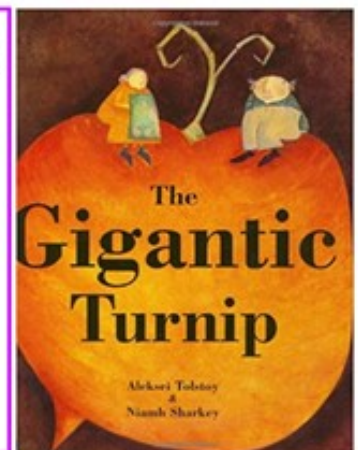
Venus - Year 1

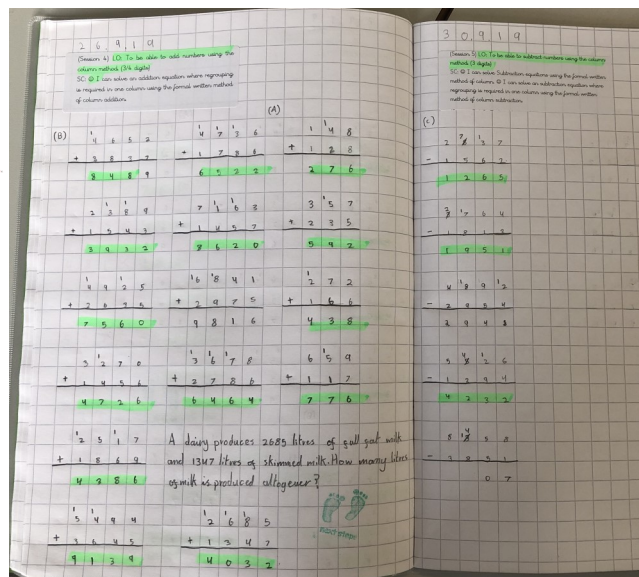

Galaxy—Year 4

This week in Galaxy Class we have been working hard to master the column subtraction approach with 4 digit numbers. Most children have understood this method and we are now moving on to applying it to number problems.



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Neptune - Year 5

This week, Neptune Class have been practising their addition and subtraction skills in mathematics. We have looked at some different methods to use including using known facts, rounding and adjusting and partitioning using place value counters.

Aurora—Year 6

Aurora Class have been writing their own autobiographies. They learned about the features of an autobiography and wrote poems about themselves. They tried hard to use alliteration and descriptive vocabulary to make their poems interesting for the reader.
