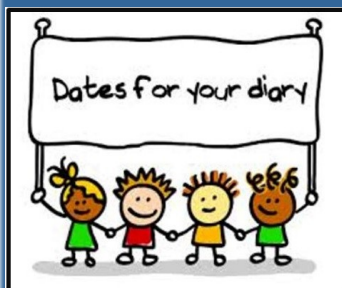

Mercury Class went to the Unicorn Theatre. The pupils saw The wolf, the duck and the mouse. Pupils enjoyed the singing and dancing.



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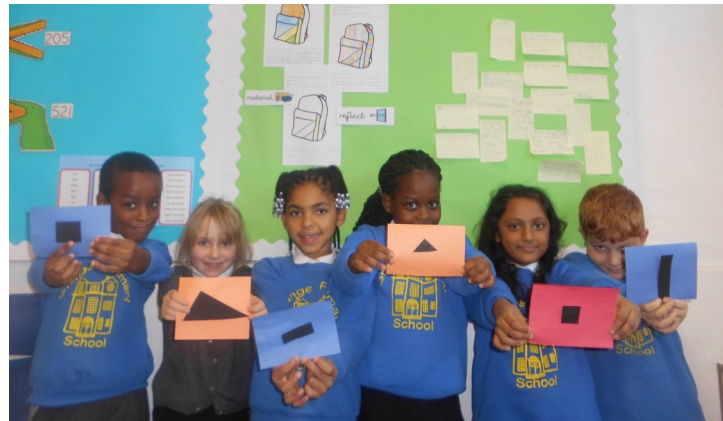


### Planet Earth

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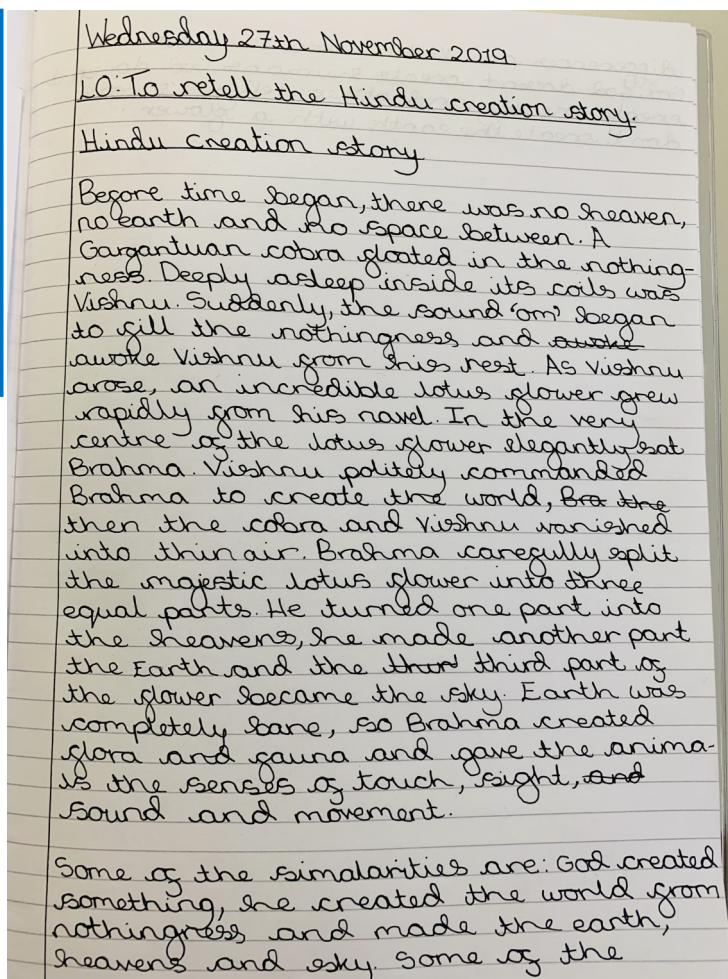
