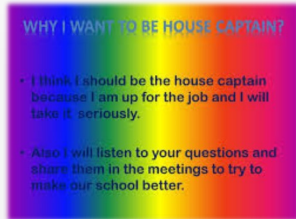

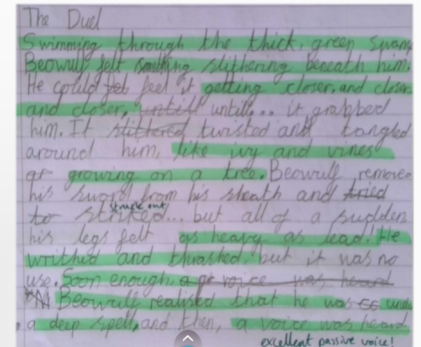

We have finished off some epic stories of Beowulf vs Grendel's Mother ... where we have tried to include effective adjectives, well punctuated speech and short suspenseful sentences – among other skills.

In Maths, we have developed other thinking around finding the difference - including alternative ways we can achieve the answer (counting on, subtraction).

In Neptune class we created bar models with manipulatives to help understand the concept of mathematical difference – a useful challenge for all.



In Science this week – we are looking at parachute investigations.

We wonder – ‘How will the size of the parachute affect the time it takes the parachute to fall?’ We will let you know how we get on next week!



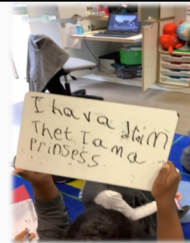
Nursery SUN

We have been discussing our fears and, ways of dealing with them. Children also made their own stress balls using balloons and semolina. Children then drew a 'feeling' face on their stress ball.

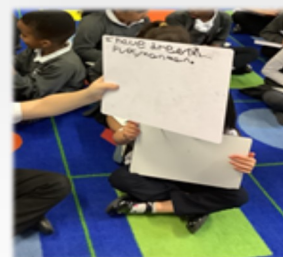
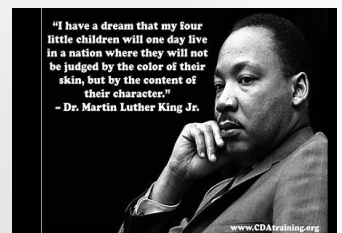


Year 1 Mercury & Venus



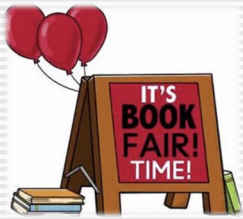
Year 1 have been celebrating, Black History Month this week.

We have been looking at the life of Martin Luther king. Children watched his iconic speech ‘I have a Dream’, which inspired them to write their own; I have a dream speech.





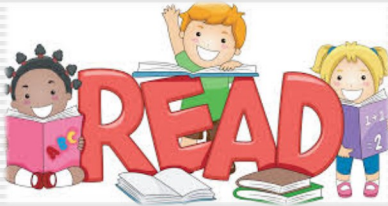

Free Food Parcel/Vouchers

Do I need to apply for a free school meal?
No, but you do need to let us know if you think you may be entitled to benefits-related free school meals (FSM).

It's important that you register for free school meals, if you think your child may be eligible, as it will enable us to receive additional funding via the Pupil Premium, totalling £1,320 per child.

This additional government funding is used by the school to help children to make the best possible progress they can and to provide additional resources and educational experiences that they may not otherwise have access to.




During lockdown, we were able to provide families with food vouchers due to their entitlement.

You must apply online (www.southwark.gov.uk/schooladmissions) and **submit your application before the closing date of 31st October 2021.**

Some Secondary schools specialise in arts, maths, languages, science or digital technology, and it is important to get a good understanding of what is on offer when making your preferences.

Before you decide which schools to apply for and your order of preference, we strongly advise that you read the guidance in the brochure, which was emailed to you.
