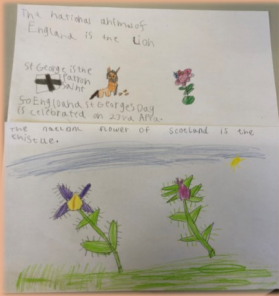

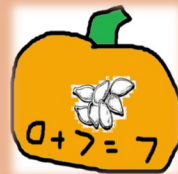
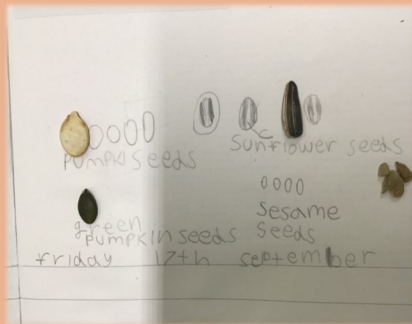
Year 2

Planet Earth & Mars



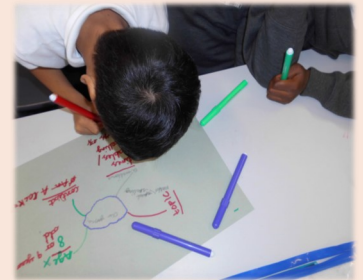
This week Year 2 have been writing their own version of the Enormous Turnip (called the Massive Onion).

Year 4

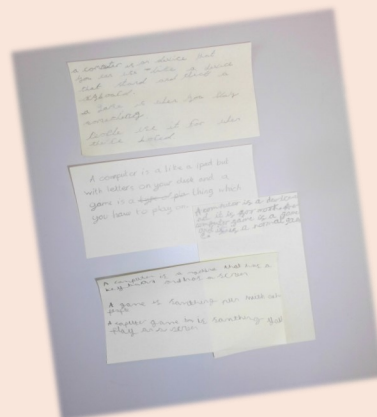
Galaxy & Supernova

We then worked in partners to develop an idea for a new and exciting educational game.





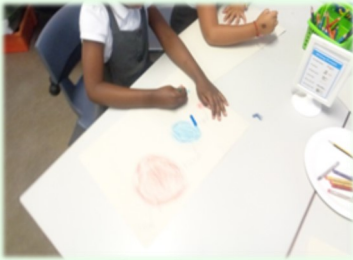

This week in the Nursery, we have continued with the topic of 'Ourselves'. Children are putting finishing touches to the paintings of the life size likeness of themselves. This week they have been using pastels on top of paint to add detail. As the Autumn season has started, we have been enjoying a lot of Autumn related art activities. We have been learning about Autumn and Autumn colours, reading books about Autumn and singing Autumn songs. Children also had fun going on 'the Autumn walk' in the school garden, where they collected leaves for investigation and art activities. Children continue learning to count to 10, Days of the Week, and Months of the Year during our Maths Meeting, and this week they have also been learning about shapes. Children practice their fine motor skills while making play dough 'pizzas', and decorating them with a variety of 'toppings'. In Sun class children continue to settle in very well and are now learning to put on and take off their coats. Some have already learned how to zip them up!

Jupiter: **Tiago** for great partitioning of 2 and 3 digit numbers.

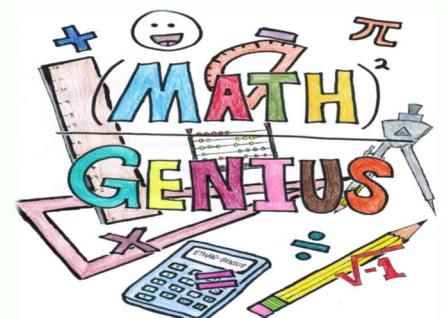

Free Food Parcel/Vouchers

Do I need to apply for a free school meal?
No, but you do need to let us know if you think you may be entitled to benefits-related free school meals (FSM).

It's important that you register for free school meals, if you think your child may be eligible, as it will enable us to receive additional funding via the Pupil Premium, totalling £1,320 per child.

This additional government funding is used by the school to help children to make the best possible progress they can and to provide additional resources and educational experiences that they may not otherwise have access to. **During lockdown, we were able to provide families with food vouchers due to their entitlement.**

Water Bottles



We are asking Parents and Carers **Not to send** their child in with flavoured or infused water.

Only plain water allowed.

Our water fountains are switched back on, but children may only use these to fill their water bottles.



Medical Appointments

Authorised Absence Request

Any other request for an absence from school, will need to be completed and authorised by/at the Headteacher's discretion.

Requests outside of term time will usually be based on pupil attendance, punctuality and personal circumstance

If you have a different collection arrangement at the end of the day, **you must call the school office NO LATER THAN 2:00pm to inform us of this change.** We cannot guarantee a message can be relayed in time, when we receive messages late in the day.

You must apply online (www.southwark.gov.uk/schooladmissions) and **submit your application before the closing date of 31st October 2021.**

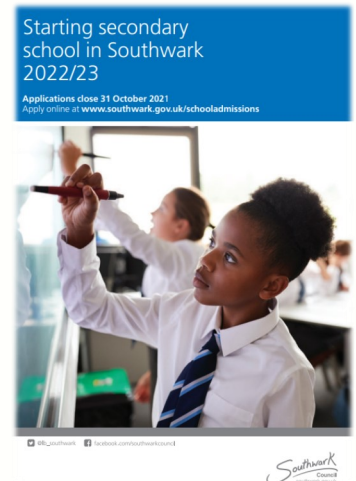
Some Secondary schools specialise in arts, maths, languages, science or digital technology, and it is important to get a good understanding of what is on offer when making your preferences.
