

Year 6 Sky Class have spent a focus week at Into University, learning all about WW1.


On Monday, we got to time travel to 1914 where we explored what it would be like living in this time, and going to war.









Nursery SUN

Water Bottles



We are asking Parents and Carers Not to send their child in with flavoured or infused water.

Only plain water allowed.

Our water fountains are switched back on, but children may only use these to fill their water bottles.

Punctuality

We will be closing the gate at 9:05am (when our last Year Group enters the building).

Any child arriving after this time; will need to enter through the school office and register a late mark - AND GIVE A REASON FOR THE LATENESS.

AT THE END OF THE DAY (Important Messages)

1)

A child will be registered LATE after school from 3:30pm. You will be called to be informed that your child will be looked after at the AFTER SCHOOL PROVISION, and a charge of up to £11.00 will be incurred for the day.

2)

If you have a different collection arrangement at the end of the day, you must call the school office NO LATER THAN 2:00pm to inform us of this change. We cannot guarantee a message can be relayed in time, when we receive messages late in the day.

Coats

As the weather is changing, we urge you to provide a coat for your child for school.

We want to ensure children are out in the fresh air as much as possible, so they need to be wrapped up warm.

Your Child's Flu Vaccination is now Due!!

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu.

Free Food Parcel/Vouchers

Do I need to apply for a free school meal?

No, but you do need to let us know if you think you may be entitled to benefits-related free school meals (FSM).

It's important that you register for free school meals, if you think your child may be eligible, as it will enable us to receive additional funding via the Pupil Premium, totalling £1,320 per child.

This additional government funding is used by the school to help children to make the best possible progress they can and to provide additional resources and educational experiences that they may not otherwise have access to.


During lockdown, we were able to provide families with food vouchers due to their entitlement.



Secondary Application 2022/2023

The Secondary application process has begun. If you require any assistance with the application process, please email the school at: office@grange.southwark.sch.uk or Telephone: 020 7771 6121 to book an appointment with Zohra Bounouar, our Administrative Officer.

You must apply online (<u>www.southwark.gov.uk/schooladmissions</u>) and <u>submit your application before</u> the closing date of 31st October 2021.

Some Secondary schools specialise in arts, maths, languages, science or digital technology, and it is important to get a good understanding of what is on offer when making your preferences.

Before you decide which schools to apply for and your order of preference, we strongly advise that you read the guidance in the brochure, which was emailed to you.

- Start finding out about schools now.-

- Look at the most recent Ofsted reports
- Talk to parents/ carers whose children attend those schools.
