
English: Literacy Tree

Maths: White Rose Multiplication and Division.



Children will learn their 10, 5,2, 3,4,8 timetables. They will also be able to divide by 10, 5, 2, 3, 4, 8.



The children will use different representation to show multiplication and division such as arrays and bar models.

Reading: Literary Leaves

Science: Kent Forces and magnets



Children will:

- Predict whether two magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing.
