READING

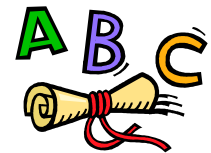


Remember to read each day and get an adult to sign your reading card /book.

2. Write about famous sites or landmarks from Ancient Rome
3. Describe the clothes/uniform of different people in Roman society
4. Describe the arrival of the Romans into a country or place - what did they bring, change or disrupt?
5. Describe what acts you might undertake as an emperor.

HAVE A GO AT ONE OF THESE TASKS

1. Create a Roman coin - represent yourself as an emperor
2. Draw or represent the changing size or spread of the Roman empire
3. Create a form of mosaic to represent something Roman (a god or temple, a food or place)
4. Create a then and now representation or drawing of a place or thing in Roman times and in the present time
