Ask your child to write a list of what shopping is needed. When you visit the supermarket, ask your child to help find the items. Read words on the signs, on packets. Children could also help with online shopping.

Give your child a list and they have to find the items. How many things can you find in the supermarket beginning with the letter 'b'?

## Design and write a postcard

Sending a postcard is a great opportunity to practice your child's writing skills over the holidays. Ask your child to draw a picture on the blank side of the postcard - it could be a drawing of your holiday, their favourite day or an illustration from a book. They can then write a message on the lined side explaining what they've drawn. Why not ask them to draw it for a family member or friend and then pop it in the post? Use this postcard template to get your child writing this summer.

Take a trip to the park and go on a **minibeast safari**. Take an old spoon and a jam jar. Explore creatures around logs and trees. Identify each insect. Watch them move, describe how they look. Which is your favourite? Don't forget to to put the creatures back where you found them.



### Build a secret hideout

Find some old boxes, blankets, cushions, rugs. You could turn your hideout into a reading den. Or you could become a detective.



Get creative! Take a trip to the park and collect natural items that are on the ground to create a collage or a sculpture for example, leaves, petals, sticks etc. All you need is some glue!



**Design a sandwich**. Choose some different ingredients that you think will make a delicious sandwich. Make the sandwich and then write the <u>recipe</u> 

## Create an A-Z scavenger hunt.

Try to find something that starts with each letter of the alphabet. Hide each item and someone in your family has to find them, for example, L is for leaf, H is for hairbrush, A is for apple.



Experiment with floating and sinking. Find lots of objects. Fill a bucket or a sink with water. Predict whether you think an object will float or sink then try it out.

# Talking Activities



Play "I spy with my little eye" Child finds something that they can see beginning with a certain letter or sound.

Take a "Picture Walk" with your child. Observe the surroundings. Keep stopping. Encourage your child to describe what they see, ask guestions and discuss what they can see.



"I can see a big lake and the trees are reflected in the water."






Play 20 questions. Adult chooses an object or a book or a place or a TV programme. The child <u>has</u> to ask questions in order to work out what it could be.

## Would you rather?

Adult asks child a question <u>e.g.</u> "Would you rather meet a dragon or a dinosaur?"

"Would you rather eat an apple or a banana?"

"Would you rather go to the seaside or to the park?" The child states their preference but <u>has to</u>.



## Odd One Out

Name three objects. One will be the odd one out. Your child has to say which is the odd one out using the word 'because' e.g.

## train banana bus

"Banana is the odd one out because train and bus are types of transport."

## Storytelling

Ask your child to tell you a story. It can be made up or they can retell a story that they know well. Read your child a story and then ask them to tell you the story just using the pictures.
