A Message from our Headteacher

Dear Parents,

It has been a busy week at Grange this week. Thank you to all of the parents that attended the workshops for early years, KS1 and SEND. Don't forget to attend our Year 3 and 4 reading meeting next Friday afternoon at 2.30pm and the meeting for children with ASD on Thursday morning at 9.30am. These workshops are a really useful way for you to see how your children are taught and offer strategies for you to help your child at home.

This week we say another goodbye to one of our teachers. Miss Cormier will be leaving us for a short time this Friday to begin her maternity leave. She has been a great help to Year 5 and 6 over the past few weeks and I know that they will particularly miss her help. We would like to wish her the best of luck and can't wait to meet her baby when he or she finally arrives.

PE Kit

We have had many children who still do not have the correct kit for PE this week. Please make sure your child brings in their PE kit on the correct day and is wearing appropriate footwear. Failure to bring in the correct school uniform kit will result in detention. Please ensure children are wearing blue or black bottoms and a plain white t-shirt for PE. We thank you in advance for your support.

Religious Education

As you know Grange is a state funded primary school. The national curriculum states the legal requirement that: 'Every state-funded school must offer a curriculum which is balanced and broadly based, and which: promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental, and physical development of pupils; and prepares pupils at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities, and experiences of later life. All state schools must teach religious education."

If you choose to withdraw your child from religious education lessons you must put this in writing to the headteacher stating your child's full name and class. In addition, you (the parent) must provide weekly work which your child can complete during the length of the religious education lesson being provided by the school. You may be asked to collect or withdraw your child for any religious trips the school has planned.

Religious education is about educating your children about different religions. There is no prayer or worship in any of the lessons we teach, children are simply made aware of the multifaith community we live in. This helps them to strengthen relationships, accept and appreciate difference. Religious education lessons help us to teach a society to accept and not to be afraid of difference. If you wish to discuss this with me further, please call to arrange an appointment. Failure to provide work for your child will mean that the child will be incorporated into the lesson being taught.


Value of the Week


Word of the Week


Year 1
