Judith Scott (May 1, 1943 -March 15, 2005) was an American fiber sculptor. She was deaf and had Down Syndrome. She was internationally renowned for her art.



Why is Nicola Anthony so famous?

One of her most noteworthy sculptures was commissioned for Steven Spielberg's Shoah Foundation, featuring the story of a Holocaust survivor, and her largest artwork ever will be emblazoning buildings in Liverpool later this year in her first foray into light-projected text artworks.
