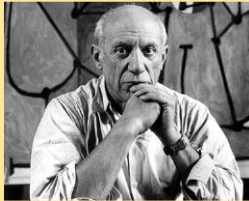


## Vocabulary

| <b>Line</b>        | A long narrow mark or bend   |
| <b>Observation</b> | The action or process of closely <u>observing</u> or monitoring something or someone.                                    |
| <b>Folding</b>     | A piece of furniture or equipment) able to be bent or <u>rearranged</u> into a <u>flatter</u> or more compact shape      |
| <b>Rolling</b>     | Moving by turning over and over on an axis   |
| <b>Twisting</b>    | Form into a bent, curling, or distorted shape.   |
| <b>Portrait</b>    | A painting, drawing, photograph, or engraving of a person, especially one depicting only the face or head and shoulders. |
| <b>Negative</b>    | Consisting in or characterized by the absence rather than the presence of distinguishing features.                       |
| <b>Positive</b>    | Consisting in or characterized by the presence rather than the absence of distinguishing features.                       |
| <b>Wrapping</b>    | Paper or soft material used to cover or enclose something.   |

## Did You Know? Interesting Facts about Picasso

Pablo Picasso was one of the most influential artists of the 20th century. His use of form, color, and perspective profoundly impacted later generations of painters, including Willem de Kooning and David Hockney. "There are artists who transform the sun into a yellow spot, but there are others who, thanks to their art and intelligence, transform a yellow spot into the sun," he once said.
