Leader: Someone others follow

Minister/Pastor: Some Christians call their church leader these words rather than priest

Priest: Used in Sikhism, Hinduism, Christianity as the term to refer to the people who is trained up in order to lead certain practices at a place of worship. In Judaism the priests in the Jewish bible were the people who created a link between God and humanity

Rabbi: a Jewish leader

Monk/nun: Many religions have these - people who have decided to live a celibate life (not get married or have a partner). Often living within a place of worship and dedicating their lives to live out their religion

Imam: Muslim mosque leader, often gives a Friday Jummah (Friday) preach and leads mosque prayers

Ordained: Has a qualification in this religion

Swami: Hindu teacher of religious importance


