Gratitude: The quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for someone or something.
To return kindness

Appreciativeness: Recognition and enjoyment of the good qualities of someone or something

Thankfulness: Warm friendly feelings of gratitude, appreciativeness, gratefulness or gratitude
