

**Vocabulary**

**Palm Sunday:** On Palm Sunday Christians celebrate the Triumphant Entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection

**The Last Supper:** The Last Supper (also called the Mystical Supper) was the last meal Jesus shared with his Twelve Apostles and disciples before his death

**Procession:** Procession is the act of going forth, advance, and proceed. In general, an organized body of people advancing in a formal or ceremonial manner

**Eucharist:** The Eucharist, also called Holy Communion, the blessed Sacrament, or The Lord's Supper is a Christian sacrament or practice, in commemoration of the Last Supper, the final meal that Jesus Christ shared with his disciples before his arrest and eventual crucifixion (killing of Jesus on a cross)

**Holy Week:** Holy week is the last week of Lent and the week before Easter Sunday. It is when Christians remember the last week of Jesus' life and is the most important time in the Christian year. There are many church services and processions

**Easter:** Important festival for the Christians. It celebrates the resurrection (rising from the dead) of Jesus. It is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the northern spring equinox
