

Vocabulary

Eid-al-Adha: Muslim celebration, celebrating the end of Hajj

Mosque: Muslim place of worship

Subha: Muslim prayer beads hung around the mosque for worship.

Eid-ul-Fitr: Muslim celebration (Muslim holiday that marks the end of Ramadan, the Islamic holy month of fasting).

Qur'an: Muslim holy book

Allah: Arabic name for God

Ibrahim: Islamic prophet Ibrahim. Jews and Christians call him Abraham

Ismail: Islamic prophet, son of Ibrahim

Muhammad (Peace be upon him – abbreviated to 'pbuh'): Islamic final prophet

Halal: Allowed for a Muslim person (e.g. specially prepared meat)

Haram: Forbidden for a Muslim person (e.g. pork, smoking)

Masjid: Mosque school
