

5 words to remember

digital: made using computers, such as images being made up of many dots, or **pixels**

layer: imagine that **digital** art is like a stack of paper – a layer is like a one piece of paper that can be drawn on separately

pixel: a little square that has a special colour – when we put lots of pixels together, they form the pictures we see on a computer or iPad screen

undo: to reverse the effect of a change in a program

zoom: to change the magnification so that only part of the overall image occupies the whole of the screen

Step 2: Imagine that your drawing is like a stack of papers. To add a new layer, ask the app to give you a fresh, clean layer on top of your first drawing.

Step 3: On this new layer, you can draw something different without changing your first drawing. It's like drawing on magical invisible paper above your first drawing! You can keep adding more layers and drawing on each one separately.



Knowledge check: Pinch to zoom

To pinch to zoom:

Step 1: First, open the Brushes Redux app on the iPad. You will see a picture on the screen that you want to make bigger or smaller.

Step 2: Put two of your fingers on the screen, just like you're making a bunny ear with your fingers. Then, move your fingers apart (like stretching the bunny ears) to make the picture bigger. If you want to make the picture smaller, bring your fingers closer together (like squishing the bunny ears).

Step 3: When you move your fingers apart, the picture will get bigger, and when you bring them closer together, the picture will get smaller. You can do this any time you want to see the details up close or see the whole picture!
