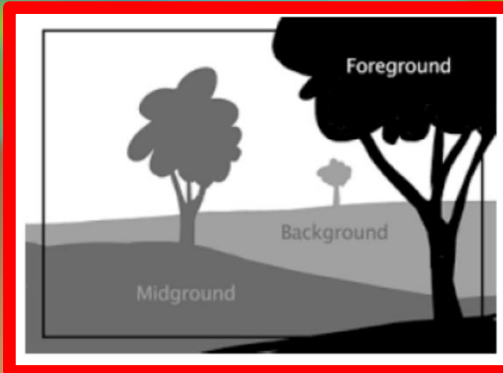

What is landscape art?

Landscape painting, also known as landscape art, is the depiction of natural scenery such as mountains, valleys, trees, rivers, and forests, especially where the main subject is a wide view—with its elements arranged into a coherent composition.

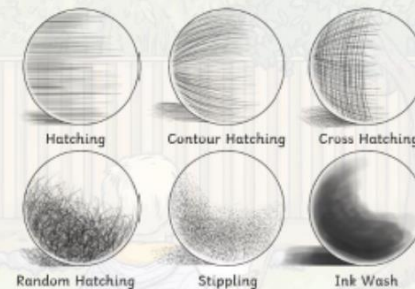
Key Vocabulary

Landscape	All the visible features of an area of land, often considered in terms of their aesthetic appeal.
Seascape	A view of an expanse of sea.
Pop art	An art movement of the 1950s to the 1970s that was primarily based in Britain and the United States.
Digital tone	The lightness or darkness of tones or colours on a digital device.
Foreground	The part of a view that is nearest to the observer.

Painting and Colour

Colours can be described as either warm or cool.

Red, orange and yellow are warm colours. They make us think of sunny, warm and cosy things.



Green, blue and violet are cool colours. They make us think of fresh, calm and chilly things.

On the colour wheel the warm colours are on one side and the cool colours are on the other side.

paint, pastels, sketch, pastel pencils, patterns, bright colours

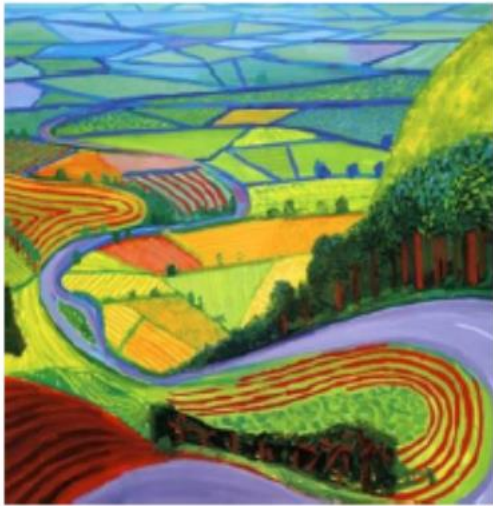

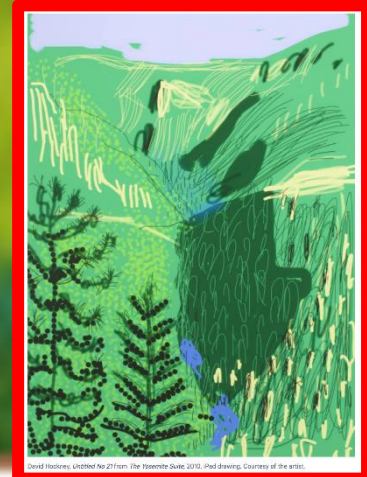

David Hockney



David Hockney is one of the most important painters of the 20th century. If you were to Google, famous British painters, there's a good chance that Hockney's name will appear. Born in Bradford in 1937, Hockney was one of the big artists involved in the pop art movement in the 1960s.
