Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the final term of this academic year. We are busy preparing for the many events which are taking place this term and preparing for the next academic year. 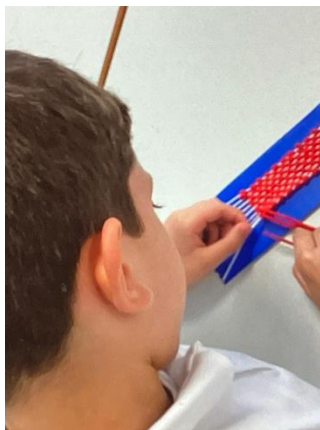
## Year 2 –Earth Class

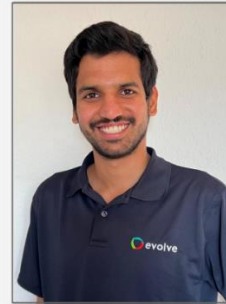
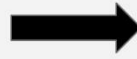
