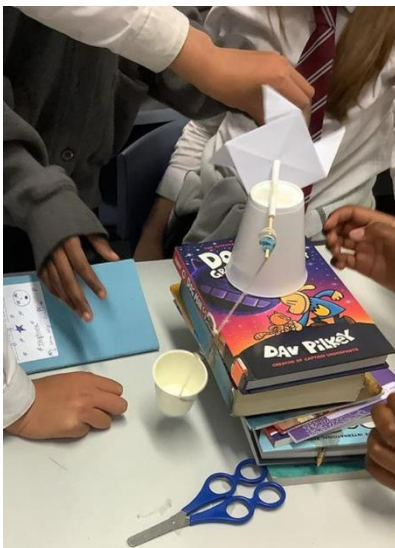
Year1 –Venus Class
